The glare from the sun through the window can also cause problems whilst using computer equipment resulting in eye strain and headaches.

Scientific studies confirm that increased temperatures directly correlate with absenteeism and negative productivity: as temperatures increase productivity decreases. At a room temperature of 28°C it has been proven there could be a 10 to 15% reduction in productivity.

Brisa Soleil, (also known as solar control, sun louvers & solar shading) can reduce the buildings heat gain problems by as much as 85%. Brise Soleil panels can also enhance the appearance of a building by making an architectural feature of the system. The reduction of direct sunlight during the summer months through the windows will automatically help to give the perception of a cooler environment leading to the occupants being much more comfortable whilst reducing the possibility of health and safety risks.

During the summer months brise soleil will block out most of the harsh summer sun whilst still allowing more natural light with the benefits of reduced thermal gain. During the winter months the sun sits lower in the sky allowing for more sunlight to pass through providing natural warmth whilst still providing reduced glare.





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Sewage problems? Allerton is your answer



Allerton UK is a leading off mains drainage company, covering sales, servicing, commissioning and repairs of all types of septic tanks, sewage treatment plants, sewage pump stations and soakaways. Working across the East Midlands and beyond, Allerton boasts a team of dedicated and experienced workers, all trained with British Water to ensure they are in the best position to properly assess a situation and correct it.

Established in 1974 by Jon Allerton, the company was originally concerned with draining farmers' fields, after the government provided grants to farmers with the aim to get the country drained. Once this was completed in the late 1980s, Allerton needed a new direction, and so began its work in off mains drainage.

As well as its sewage treatment plants and sewage pump stations which are made on the premises, Allerton also makes the ConSept. This

the treated water to the surface, disposing of the treated effluent is a lot better than other methods.

The ConSept uses the existing septic tank, removing the need to install a heavy plant or new tank, and it is quick to install to save time, money and disruption. The tank has no moving parts inside, and it maintains the water at the correct level, keeping your drains clear right up to the house. Moreover, it is manufactured using high grade composite materials and non-ferrous components, meaning the ConSept does not corrode, offering a long and trouble-free life.



Installation inside your existing septic tank also means that the ConSept cannot be seen or heard, and the air blower remains outside the tank for easy maintenance. The equipment also has low maintenance costs, requiring servicing just once a year and desludging and emptying



converts septic tanks into sewage treatment plants, and can be fitted without excavations, apart from the shallow cable and air pipe trenches. This means customers can save around £3,000+VAT by avoiding excavators on site. What's more, because the ConSept lifts

once every two years. While the local desludger can empty the tank or sewage plant, Allerton will of course service and maintain all their own equipment and that all other manufactures units too, in fact servicing, repairs and surveys of sewage treatment plants is a major part of



their work. The final effluent is discharged into a watercourse or soakaway, and installation and commissioning by Allerton's British Water Accredited engineers is included in the package.

Not only does Allerton install high quality units, the company also focuses on continual service of the equipment. This means that units Allerton has made and installed, of which there are over 1,200, are all still working efficiently across the country. Indeed, Allerton often receives regular customer feedback which emphasises how happy they are with the service they have received.

"In particular, we make sure everything is explained to the customer from the beginning and throughout the process, and we always do what we say we will," said Jon Allerton, Director. "Minor problems are sorted out by engineers on site, and all the initial customer worries are dealt with in advance. "We used to manufacture our own sewage treatment plants, until the EU decided they

Now, we use WPL, one of the top two or three manufacturers of sewage plants, and they listen to us when we suggest improvements," Jon explained.

In line with its ongoing expansion, Allerton has been taking on more staff and training them all to British Water standards. "I'm 78 soon, and



the company has been recently restructured and is now Allerton Bradley Ltd. Jason Bradley has been a large shareholder for several years, and has worked for the company for most of his life. His knowledge of all things sewage is vast, and at 36, he ensures the company can look forward to another 50 years of good service, and pleasing people!"

Together we can create forests for the future

Established in 2014 by Nick Hollingworth and Liz Boivin, Tomorrow's Forests are specialists in high volume commercial reforestation, supporting industry, resource management, government, private landowners, and public institutions. "A lot of building work now requires tree planting, so we work with railway projects, housing developments, infrastructure and many others to help do this with cutting-edge technology," explains Liz.

After winning its first contract in 2014 to plant 90,000 trees, Tomorrow's Forests has grown significantly and now plants around 2 million trees each year across



its numerous contracts. "After our first contract, we started gaining more, doing subcontracting in Yorkshire as well as some work in Scotland. Since then, we have established ourselves as a main contractor for the work we do and cover the whole of England, Wales, and Scotland," Liz adds.

This success is in no doubt down to Tomorrow's Forests' efficient, fast, and proactive nature. "When we start working with new clients, we often get positive feedback on how fast our team works. Our

professional tree planters can plant around 3,000 trees a day each, so no project is too big or too small for us.

All of our team is trained and works hard during all daylight hours. For forestry work, we use a shift pattern of four days on, one day off. This helps to promote productivity, as they get a consistent day off that comes quicker than doing a five-day week as well as reducing the risk of injury. If we are working on construction sites, it is a five-day week, but the nature of the work is different from standard forestry."

In September 2020, a sister company was established called Creating Tomorrow's Forests, with the mission to fight climate change by creating forests across the UK, providing new habitats for wildlife, and removing CO2 from the air. Creating Tomorrow's Forests was launched to make it easy for individuals and businesses to make a positive impact on the planet and replace the UK's lost forests, using Tomorrow's Forests' large-scale forestry experience.

Instead of just planting trees for carbon sequestration, Creating Tomorrow's Forests is passionate about developing diverse woodland habitats for the long-term. The project uses the Tomorrow's Forests planting expertise with scientific research to make sure the right species of trees are planted in the right areas, and additional habitat such as ponds and meadows are created alongside to maximise the biodiversity at each site.

For this reason and because of the push for carbon capture schemes, Creating Tomorrow's Forests has been getting more and more interest from businesses and individuals. We are looking forward to developing the company further next year. We currently plant 2 million trees each year with Tomorrow's Forests, and we want to reach the same point with our sister company."

in tree planting and the benefits it has, sequestering carbon and creating biodiversity and habitats for animals. I think COVID-19 has brought things into perspective for a lot of people in this sense."

Indeed, although the pandemic halted many of Tomorrow's Forests' operations in line with the construction industry, it meant they had more time to focus on developing their new venture. "We want to work on expanding Creating Tomorrow's Forests, acquiring more sites and diversifying what we offer. Once we've completed the site in Somerset we'll be moving onto somewhere else."

And it is certainly true what Liz says – during

This year, Graf UK is seeing increased interest in its wastewater treatment and rainwater

to mains drainage for sewage disposal, so they are having to purchase sewage treatment plants as well."

This is not the only change Graf UK has seen this year. "A key thing we've done this year is that we've taken our garden products and created an e-commerce site for them, which was driven by the fact people are spending more time at home and in their gardens. Because this was so successful, we'll be doing a similar thing with our rainwater harvesting systems. Some self-builders or people doing extensions to their home are considering rainwater harvesting systems, so we'll be selling them on their own e-commerce site."

Looking to the future, Graf UK will be continuing its admirable work in offering sustainable water management systems for the construction

industry, as well as adding value to the market with training schemes. "We're going to start training installers for servicing and maintenance of wastewater treatment systems. We usually run seminars in Banbury for installers to become accredited service providers. We managed to do some of these this year, but obviously couldn't do as many as we wanted to due to the pandemic."

"We're looking forward to doing more of these in 2021 to help build a growing network of trained personnel that can look after the systems. This is mainly for wastewater treatment systems, with some involvement in the rainwater harvesting systems as well."





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Off-grid heating industry 'willing and able' to deliver more cost-effective route to net zero for rural households

More than 45 leading players in the off gas grid heating industry have written to the Minister of State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) underlining their readiness to rapidly deploy a renewable liquid fuel solution to replace oil heating during the 2020s.

The fuel - Hydrotreated Vegetable Oil (HVO) - offers a near 'drop-in' replacement for heating oil (kerosene), avoiding the high installation costs associated with other low carbon heating solutions such as heat pumps and biomass, and promises to cut carbon emissions from oil heated homes by over 90%.

Following successful laboratory tests and European field trials, HVO is now being assessed in homes across the UK. It is expected that these trials will prove conclusively that HVO is a viable option that the

UK government needs to support alongside other renewable heating technologies. Existing homes off the gas grid present a number of decarbonisation challenges - in Great Britain, over 760,000 (65%) are in the least efficient EPC bands E - G making them difficult and expensive to convert to the low carbon technologies the government currently supports.

According to BEIS, the average cost to bring these homes up to an acceptable Band C is £12,300 from Band E and £18,900 from Bands F and G. Fitting an air source heat pump would, on average, add a further £10,900 to these figures, a ground source heat pump some £22,500, and a biomass system around £16,100. Few households can afford these costs. By comparison, converting existing oil heating systems to run on HVO would cost no more than £500 for a working

boiler, or £3,000 if the boiler is broken and needs replacing. There would also be no pressing need to upgrade property insulation, although this is of course preferable to reduce running costs and further minimise carbon emissions.

Supporting HVO through appropriate policies could save rural households and the government many millions of pounds and would ensure practical options are available for all housing types and incomes. While heat pumps offer an excellent solution in the right setting, they are not appropriate for all properties and HVO is the perfect solution to fill that gap.





The Vertex Business Park is a 4.8 acre site located in the Emersons Green Enterprise zone. Being just four miles from junction 19 on the M4 motorway, the 11 warehouse/office complex has tree lined boulevards and generous landscaped areas incorporating dedicated car parks, concreted access and hard standing designed to handle HGV traffic. With such a large concreted area an effective surface water drainage system was essential.

Having supplied high capacity surface water drainage channels for hard-standing areas at numerous distribution centres throughout the UK, Hauraton were confident their RECYFIX® HICAP® high capacity channels would comply with the stringent specification asked for by the contractors.

Three sizes of RECYFIX® HICAP® F-2000, 3000 and 5000, with a loading category Class F900 (900kN) were used to drain the HGV hard standing and car park areas at the Park. All the sizes supplied had fixed ductile iron, 14mm

Hauraton surface drainage and service channel systems installed at Central Park, Avonmouth

At 600 acres, Central Park, Avonmouth, Bristol is a warehouse and distribution development, strategically located between the M49 motorway on its Eastern boundary and the A403 to the West. These roads connect to the M4(J22) to the North and the M5(J18) to the South. In addition to the excellent road network the development is located near a rail terminal and container port. When fully developed, Central Park is destined to be the South West's largest distribution hub. With the completion of the Phase 1 it already provides distribution warehousing for companies such as Royal Mail, Lidl, Tesco, Next, Warburtons, GKN, The Range, DHL, Amazon, Farmfoods, Davies Turner and CHEP.

The sheer size of the Central Park development has meant that various companies have invested the Park's facilities. A 40 acre site has been built by Berberry, a privately owned property development and investment company based in the West Midlands. They demanded the contractors achieve the highest environmental standards for the surface water drainage systems installed.

With areas designated for HGV access and hard standing, car parks and areas accessed by smaller commercial vehicles, the road and yard surfaces employed included concrete, asphalt and



block paving. This meant various types of surface channelling were required by the contractor, Churngold Construction, to ensure the drainage needs of the site as a whole. Hauraton systems; RECYFIX® HICAP®, FASERFIX® SUPER, RECYFIX® MONOTEC and ENVIROKERB were chosen to meet the drainage requirements. FASERFIX® SERVICE channel was also specified to house cables and coolant pipe-work.

These channels feature metal protection along their top edges, not only does this detail provide exceptional wear resistance and increased load bearing capability, the components are so strong, even prior to installation they are able to endure the rigours of building sites.

Tim Connolly Managing Director at Hauraton was pleased that drainage contractor, Churngold Construction, found the ENVIROKERB drainage components easy to install. "Having the appearance of standard concrete kerb, the ENVIROKERB components are in fact made from 100% RECLAIMED polyethylene PET, HDPE and LDPE plastic bottles and packaging materials.

Each half metre component weighs far less than concrete, allowing units to comply with the maximum 25kg "one-man-lift" legislation. In addition, the recycled material is impact resistant making the components almost unbreakable and much less vulnerable to the usual on-site damage prior to pavement and roadway completion".

As well as the surface drainage products supplied, 13 metres of FASERFIX® SERVICE 300 channels with Class E600 ductile iron covers were installed providing protection for cables and coolant pipe-work to two condenser units. The 300mm channel incorporates a perforated steel galvanised cable tray that is suspended within the run keeping the cables and pipe-work clear of any water that may access the channel. The water is then safely drained away.

Cat Jones, the Hauraton Project Manager for this job, commented; "Although the original Hauraton channel selection was agreed, specification changes during construction meant the channels needed to be changed at short notice. Working closely alongside the contractor ensured that when changes were required we quickly provided a solution that ensured site-work could continue without delay. Detailed project management is essential when dealing with large sites".

Acoustic Windows Keep the Peace at former US embassy



When it comes to luxury redevelopments, they don't come much more complex than former US Embassy building No 1 Grosvenor Square with its rebuilt stone façade, SFS on springs and listed building status. The design and installation of sympathetic timber windows and doors for such a project is far from straight forward which means it is ideal for George Barnsdale.

Having seen the work Barnsdales carried out at 20 Grosvenor Square, Lodha decided from a very early stage that the Lincolnshire based manufacturer would supply the fenestration for their own "presidential" project.

Set in the heart of Mayfair with its replica Oval Office, No 1 Grosvenor Square is a prestigious development of high end luxury apartments. One of the key requirements was to mitigate for the underground noise using a complex internal rebuild on giant springs to absorb vibration and sound.

One of the biggest challenges the Barnsdale team had to overcome was installing the windows before the external envelope was completed. This meant that windows were

effectively located mid air using gridlines. This was a highly complex process as window one might be 300mm in front of gridline while window 2 was 1500mm. The result of this was nearly 70 interface drawings!

Commenting Tom Wright, MD at George Barnsdale said "Whilst the SFS was designed to move, the external walls of the building (rebuilt brick and stone façade) remained static so the technical challenge of installing windows in this scenario where there was marked differential movement was considerable. We worked closely with Illbruck to develop and interface that would work with their SFS/façade detail taking into account waterproofing, acoustic and weather performance."

Early involvement enabled George Barnsdale to provide a detailed programme through the tender stage to ensure that the contractor had a good understanding of the critical timeframes and could make the right decisions at the right time. As time progressed, such collaboration with the architect and the wider project team proved invaluable to the process of



overcoming issues as soon as they arose minimising disruption.

The windows themselves were specified to meet the octave specific noise reduction and the whole window's acoustic performance was validated not just the centre pane glazing data.

"Unlike other manufacturers, we don't just rely on glass manufacturer data because as soon as glazing is put into a frame, it's performance is affected. Instead we have a vast array of tested technical and acoustic data as well as the installation detail to ensure accurate calculation of acoustic and thermal performance of the entire window." Tom continued.

Alongside ultra high acoustic performance, the project demanded a very high level of security with integrated security contacts and fitted custom handles to the doors.

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
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
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Public Sculpture

As a leading ICF building envelope specialist, Passive Building Structures is using its fully integrated system to meet passive house airtightness, U-values and thermal bridging requirements, creating a building with a floor area of just under 5,000 ft² over three floors.

All of the floors, walls and the roof meet a U-value of 0.11, which includes an insulated raft foundation with two layers of 150 mm EPS.

This is in addition to ICF walls which feature a 200 mm concrete core sandwiched between an inner layer of 108 mm EPS and an outer layer with 108 mm plus another 102 mm EPS.



Passive Building Structures' rapid roof ultra-panel, which consists of 300 mm EPS, has been engineered to eliminate any purlins or collar ties, meaning it promotes open plan living.

What's more, the company supplied and erected internal load bearing ICF walls, and the house also boasts precast concrete floors and internal stairs on two floors.

There is also a 1.5 metre cantilever to the front elevation on the first floor, which had to be offset for protection of tree roots on site. The cantilever is fully incorporated into the building as well as being fully insulated, ensuring zero cold bridging.

It has been created with reinforced concrete beams integrated into the wall and insulated raft foundation, eliminating the need for exposed structural steels. The building will also soon boast passive house certified windows and MVHR.

Key to Passive Building Structures' offering is the fact it delivers a complete thermal building fabric on its projects.

Incorporating unique details into its system, all of Passive Building Structures' components are

interconnected and are integral elements to the overall project. The system is poured monolithically from floor to floor.
